2019-4-002 May Board Meeting Cancellation

Greg made a motion to cancel the May board meeting because of the county closure for the Memorial Day holiday and Codi seconded. All were in favor. (KB/GB/AG/MD/PE/CH/JN/JS-Aye)

Informational Agenda Items

Champions Recovery Programs

Regina Boerkamp and Lana Frank from Champions presented on Champions' recovery programs.

CFTN Public Hearing

Fil Leanos and Albert Swanson from Behavioral Health presented an update on plans for the MHSA CFTN fund expenditure. Chairman Neves opened a public hearing, which produced the following discussion/comments:

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Q: Greg: What is different in this update from the last update on this project?

A: The update was presented on March 25th, which started the 30 day public comment period. Today is a public hearing and is the closing of the 30 day public comment period.

A: There is significant additional revisions: We've increased the amount of money to be allocated. Recently, the county conducted an ADA compliance review of the Kings View building (which is a county-owned building). There was some significant findings. Approximately \$200,000 worth. We want to add more monies towards the actual recovery and wellness theme in addition to separating the lobby and entrance areas. It's been revised by adding monies.

Q: Michael: New space is being created at Kings View for the lobby. Any ideas as to the footage that is going to be added?

A: The kids' area at present will be turned into an adult seating area. Square footage is not being added to the building. Space is being reallocated.

Q: Michael: Regarding Plan 1B, is there already a proposed community partner that we're going to be renting the office space from?

A: Nothing formal at this point: still behind-the-scenes talks and negotiations. The community has voiced their concern that they want services to be out there. We need community partners to bring some resources and then we'll collaborate.

Q: Michael: I'm guessing then that the amount of rent that we'll be paying to this community partner would ideally be less than the \$50,000 that we're allocating towards it?

A: Yes, that's what we're hoping for.

Q: Michael: Does that seem like a feasible expectation?

A: At this point, it does. We want to have access and linkage in Avenal.

A: The services are there. They're just not all coordinated in one place. We have Human Services, Health and Behavioral Health. The goal is to bring them all under one roof. That's why, at first, we wanted to build a building, but didn't have the budget. It turns out we have other partners in the community who are building and may have enough space for us to rent, so we can help bring departments together. We like people to only have to go to one place to get a lot of the services.

Q: Greg: You're planning on telepsych services at that location?

A: At some point, yes.

Q: Greg: Are there other people within the community that have an interest in the telepsych services that you're working with? If that's beyond the scope of this, that's fine. Just tell me that's for another day.

A: It's for another day.

Q: Greg: Ok, my other question, then, would be about the funding, the source of funding. That comes from?

A: Capital Facilities and Technological Needs and there isn't any more funding for that specifically coming, that I'm aware of, from MHSA dollars. We're using the 07/08 funds. We actually had to get an extension to make this happen, to spend it all.

Q: Greg: And that comes from the state to the county?

A: Mental Health Services Act money; from Proposition 63.

Q: Greg: Right, but does it go through the Board of Supervisors?

A: Yes. We take our plans to them.

Q: Greg: And then they approve this amount of money?

A: Yes.

A: Yes, this is actually going to go to them, as well. The advisory board is part of the chronological chain of events.

A: And the tele-medicine has always been a high priority. Because there's a lot of dermatology or some other medical needs, if we can go ahead and tie that to mental health services, that's the intent.

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Q: Greg: If we're back on telepsych, then, it was my understanding that Adventist Health is doing something psych?

A: Yes. This would basically be our psychiatrist who's providing telepsych here, just switching over to that office to see a patient over there. That's all.

A: But, we do have some cloud based problems. We can piggy back on the school education system because they're tied in together, but they don't have Comcast over there. They're on a different provider. We're going to have to go through a different system, to be able to deliver that. And the bandwidth is somewhat short right now. So, we have some infrastructure issues that we're having to deal with. It's not just as easy as flipping a switch. There's going to be some infrastructure and capital investment needs in order to get the bandwidth. But, even West Hills has that problem even with the online classes. We really need to try to work on the digital divide across that mountain range and Pleasant Valley. Because they're technically not part of the San Joaquin Valley.

All funds for the Kings View remodel have to be expended by June 2020 and we're expediting it to make it work.
